WHEREAS: A lifetime of dreams came true for Doug Flutie and Boston College on December 1, 1984 in New York, when the Eagle quarterback was named the Fiftieth Winner of the Heisman Trophy, the highest honor that can be awarded to a college football player, and

WHEREAS: Doug Flutie was awarded this honor within a few hours after he led his team to a 45-10 victory over arch-rival Holy Cross at Worcester for their ninth victory of the season, and

WHEREAS: Doug Flutie set N.C.A.A. 1A Records by compiling 11,317 total yards offense and 10,579 total yards passing, against the top teams in the country, and over a four year period led the Eagles to a 30-11-1 Record, and

WHEREAS: Doug Flutie has captured the admiration of all football fans by his courage in adversity, by responding to the most difficult challenges with the heart of a lion and the grace of a gazelle bringing victory from apparent defeat in the final minutes of the game on so many occasions, and has become a sports legend by pulling off the seemingly impossible victory against Miami in the Orange Bowl with no time left on the clock, therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record congratulating Doug Flutie for his outstanding achievement on the football field with the hope that his future will be blessed with continued success in the years to come.

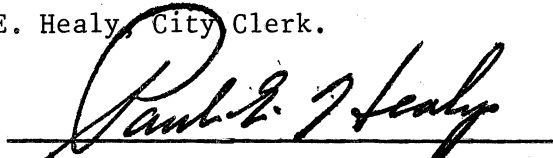
