of the City of Cambridge,

Gentlemen:-

In answer to your order requesting me to report "what facilities for escape in case of fire are available in connection with the women's detention room at the City Building, Brattle Square" the following report is submitted:-

The detention room in the Brattle Square Building is located on the third floor at the rear of the building, the entrance to it being directly opposite a staircase which leads to the ground floor. There are two additional exits, one by means of the staircase opposite the detention room leading upstairs to the floor above and thence by a corridor to the front of the building, and the other by taking the corridor on the third floor to the front of the building and descending by the staircase to the ground floor.

When in use, the matron in charge is always present in the room.

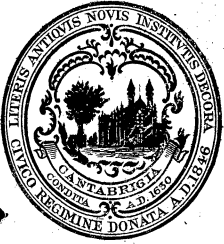

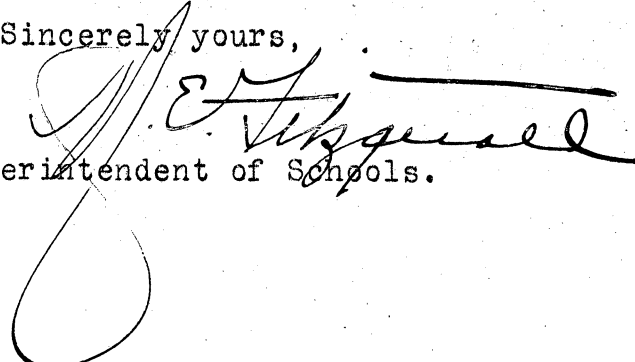
To the City Hospital Trustees,
