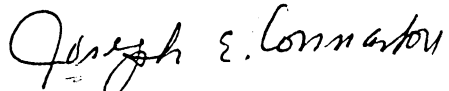
- * safety issues at the Alewife Station, especially the opening of the Police sub-station and increased police patrols in the Alewife area.

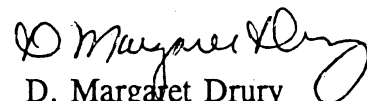

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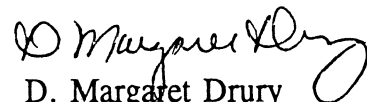

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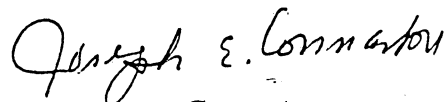
