The following structures were boarded up by the City of Cambridge and the present status of them are as follows:

- 165 Elm Street - Permit issued to rehabilitate.
- 137-141 Erie Street - Still boarded, owner being approached by persons desiring to demolish and construct new dwellings.
- 10-12 Eaton Street - Razed by owner.
- 184 Harvard Street - City Treasurers Office trying to acquire.
- 197 Harvard Street - Razed by City of Cambridge.
- 226 River Street - Cambridge Savings Bank granted \$20,000 loan to owner to rehabilitate.
- 70-72 School Street - Permit issued to rehabilitate.
- 14-16 Marion Street - Permit issued to rehabilitate.
