

Whereas the City of Cambridge is about to accept Forest Street, as a public street in said City, in pursuance of the Report of the Committee on Roads and Bridges, dated May 8. 1872, when I, Oliver D. Campbell, of said Cambridge, shall have removed my barn and fence, now encroaching upon the line of said Street, and shall execute a release to the City of the Land covered by the present buildings, reserving the right to maintain my dwelling house as it now stands until I or my heirs or assigns shall see fit to remove the same, or until the said City shall remove it by due process of law, Now know all men, that I, the said Oliver D. Campbell in consideration of the premises, agree, forthwith to remove my said barn and fence back from the line of said Street, and hereby release to said City of Cambridge all my right, title and interest in and to said land within the

limits of said Street as appears by the
Plan and profile of the Same referred to
in said report, now covered by said
baru fence and dwelling house, reserving
my right to maintain my said dwelling
house as it now stands, until I or my
heirs or assigns shall see fit to remove
the same, or until said City shall remove
it by due process of law, at the charge
of said City for removing and all
damages caused thereby except for
land.
