COUNCILLOR VELLUCCI

- WHEREAS: Recent newspaper articles have indicated that some bureaucrats by way of a memorandum wished to limit the state funded Home Care service after July 1, 1979 for the elderly unless they demonstrated "real need as opposed to average need"; and
- WHEREAS: The Home Care program has been a godsend for the elderly who live alone or are left alone while the family breadwinners go out and earn their daily bread; therefore be it
- ORDERED: That this City Council go on record favoring the extension of the Home Care Program for all elderly who are in need of these services and that any doubts to their need be resolved in favor of the elderly; and be it further
- ORDERED: That a copy of this order be sent to Governor Edward King to congratulate him for rescinding the memorandum of the Elder Affairs Department which would have deprived the elderly of these basic services; and be it further
- ORDERED: That a copy of this order be sent to all the representatives from Cambridge in the Great and General Court to record the position of the City Council in this matter.
