Tunnel Under Railroad Tracks Behind Fitzgerald School

- WHEREAS:** The safety of the children of the City of Cambridge is of great importance to this City Council, and
- WHEREAS:** The commuter rail track which runs behind the Fitzgerald School is being crossed by children living in the area, who are using it as a short cut from their homes to their school, through a hole in the fence next to the track, and
- WHEREAS:** A tunnel beneath the track does exist, which could provide safe passage, but which also is flooded and filled with garbage, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That the Cambridge City Council request the City Manager to investigate the matter of the short cut across the commuter rail track at the rear of the Fitzgerald School (Pemberton Street) to the Walden Park Apartments, with a view to increasing the safety of children walking from their homes in that area to the Fitzgerald School, and be it further
- RESOLVED:** That in the course of this investigation, Mrs. Virginia Savage of Winslow Street, Cambridge, be consulted.
