WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Lafayette L. Bingham, Sr. on April 22, 2001; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette L. Bingham entered the United States Navy on December 9, 1943 at the age of seventeen where he trained at Aviation Metal Smith Third Class USNR School; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette L. Bingham worked permanent Shore Patrol duty in Los Angeles, California he ended his duty with the United States Navy with an honorable discharge in 1946; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette L. Bingham then joined the 272nd F.A. Bn. NNG National Guard of Boston and trained at Camp McCoy, Wisconsin. He was assigned to Headquarters Battery 272nd Field F.A. Bn. NNG as Light Aircraft Mechanic; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette L. Bingham also attended helicopter school in Biloxi, Mississippi and finished number one in his class; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette L. Bingham's unit was called on September 18, 1950 to active duty during the Korean War. Lafayette and his squad were responsible for keeping all aircraft in top condition home and abroad; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette L. Bingham served with his four brothers during his years with the 272nd. He was separated from service with an honorable discharge at the conclusion of his tour of duty with the 272nd F.A. Bn. NNG; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette L. Bingham then worked as a civilian employee at Hanscom Air Force Base in Bedford Massachusetts for over 25 years as an airframe repairman, working on the skins of military aircraft; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette L. Bingham's favorite past time was playing sports, especially softball. He played and coached many teams in Cambridge and Boston and umpired in the RNDCL League for over twenty years; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette L. Bingham played semi-pro baseball for the Boston Wolverines and later became a trainer for John Dawson's football team in the Boston Park League, which won a championship; and

WHEREAS: Lafayette's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his wife Betty (Owens) Bingham; his children Lafayette L. Jr., Wayne J., Thomas L. Sr., Neil B., Virginia J., Elizabeth L. and Traci A. Bingham; his grandchildren Lindsey Thorne-Bingham, Keith Thorne-Bingham, Thomas L. Bingham, Jr. and Nicholas C. Bingham; his siblings Lavinia Frasier, Ruth Terry, Ann Evelyn and Francis Bingham, Sr.; and his many nieces, nephews and friends; and

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of Lafayette L. Bingham, Sr. at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

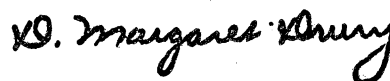
