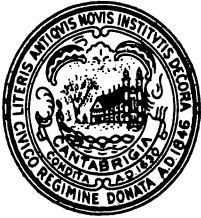

SUBJECT: Psychiatry Residency Training Grant

The National Institute of Mental Health, an agency of The Department of Health, Education and Welfare, has awarded a grant of \$56,523 to the City of Cambridge each year for a five year period. The Grant provides \$22,236 for personnel, \$4,187 for indirect costs and \$30,100 for resident stipends. It assists us in paying the costs for our psychiatric residency program which in July of 1974 will consist of six first-year, four second year, 5 third year and one part-time fourth year psychiatric residents. The City of Cambridge funds six psychiatric residents, others are state funded and this grant allows us to meet a deficit of funding for four residents. In addition, it allows us to develop adequate faculty for their training. Over the next three years we plan to move to our fully accredited complement of six first, six second and six third year residents and the grant assists us with this funding with no additional cost to the City.

Psychiatric residents are trained in our service program and provide a range of services for the citizens of Cambridge. The first year they work on our in-patient unit (which has 22 beds with 300 admissions/year), the 24-hour emergency service (which provides 150 visits/month), community programs and in the Cambridge-Somerville unit of the Westborough State Hospital (where over 150 Cambridge residents are hospitalized at any one time). In the second year they also work in our out-patient clinic (which provides 10,000 visits/year), in the child psychiatry service, hospital consultation service and after-care programs. Similarly, in the third year they work throughout our program at the hospital and in the community. Psychiatric residents provide evaluation and treatment services and consult to and "back-up" a variety of other community agencies. They are a crucial aspect of our service delivery system in mental health and our range of services to this community in part depends upon them.

The Psychiatric Residency Program is accredited at The Cambridge Hospital, affiliated with the Harvard Medical School, and a central part of the Cambridge-Somerville Mental Health and Retardation Center. It is administrated under the aegis of the Department of Health and Hospitals and The Cambridge Hospital by the Director of the Department of Psychiatry, (John E. Mack, M.D.) and the Associate Director of the Department (Lee B. Macht, M.D.).


