Subject City Council Order #15 of May 6, 1985 "Huron Avenue Bridge Opening"

The Traffic Department has completed a traffic study of the existing conditions on Huron Avenue between Aberdeen Avenue and Grove Street. This study will be compared to a study that will be done after the bridge is opened to show us what is happening and what we can do about any problem that arises.

We do anticipate an increase in automobile traffic to the volume that was there before the closing and we also anticipate a decrease in traffic on Cushing Street and Aberdeen Avenue.

We also anticipate that with the added number of vehicles using this street that there will be vehicles violating the speed limit. We will check all signing in this area and replace any that are missing.

At the same time, we will be checking traffic on Cushing Street and Aberdeen Avenue.

Sir:

The traffic division has been monitoring the Huron Ave.-Aberdeen Ave. bridge since the opening.

At the present time the traffic flow on Huron Ave. and Aberdeen Ave. has been normal i.e. moderate traffic, no delays in any direction.

The traffic division will monitor the Bridge location as well as the Belmont/Cushing Street area for violators. Since the bridge has only been open for a few days, we will have to wait and see if the AM and PM commuters have rediscovered a new route (Grove-Huron Ave) for them to take other than Fresh Pond Parkway.

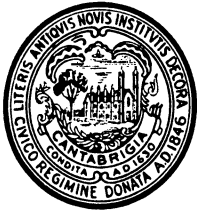
We further believe that the opening of the bridge will reduce the number of motor vehicles using Cushing street, thus relieving traffic pressure on Belmont and Cushing streets.
