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but persons with disabilities continue to be abused by police and public officials who think it is funny when a woman, a gay or a black person insults a white disabled citizen. That is racism, sexism and heterophobia at its best; encouraged by City officials.

On Wednesday March 20, 2002 at about 1:30 PM I called to the Cambridge Human Rights Commission. Michael Demakakos an intern investigator answered and I explained the incident described above. Mr. Demakakos said to me, "Do you want my job?" I said, "I want your boss Quoc Tran put in jail." At this, point Mr. Demakakos went berserk and began a tirade insulting me. He said I had no right to utter hate speech about his boss. That fighting words were not protected speech.

He explained that he was a graduate of law school but would not reveal which school. He suggested I submit a request under the Public Records act.

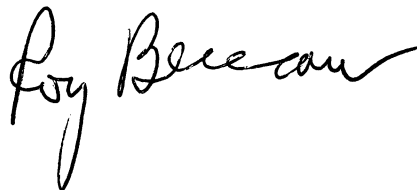
I reminded Mr. Demakakos that he was a public official and had to put up with unpleasant citizens. That that was a part of his job. I asked him what kind of people called to the Human Rights Commission. I suggested that they were people who have been harmed by others. That it was the duty of the Human Rights Commission to address such abuses, not to insist that the victims act pleasantly. I reminded Mr. Demakakos that a breach of duty was a crime. That Mr. Tran had violated his duty repeatedly as had former Executive Directors of the Human Rights Commission.

Nonetheless he was unrepentant and continued to insult me calling me immature and infantile after I used those words to describe his behavior. This is the latest unsuccessful attempt to get the Human Rights Commission to address unlawful discrimination by City employees and Harvard officials. In a letter printed in the *Cambridge Chronicle* Mr. Tran stated his belief that it "was a conflict of interest" to do so.

This shows poor, no or negligent training, intentional acts by the Human Rights commission to inflict stress and to deprive me of the right to file a complaint, one more First Amendment violation. But also violations of the City, state and US laws on discrimination.

On Thursday March 21, 2002 at about 6:45 PM I called to the Cambridge police dispatcher and left a message with dispatcher Watson for dispatcher Sheridan that once again the Chinese male was in apartment # 2 currently a vacant apartment. During the evening of March 21, 2002 a Chinese male watched me while I did research at the Cambridge Public library. This is continuing surveillance by criminal Chinese police. For several years previous, the local police and Harvard police used black informants. This is an ongoing racist abuse of police powers. It is a serial government bias crime against a disabled citizen. I am neither Chinese nor Black.

Please add this list of offenses, as part of this ongoing campaign by Racketeering Influenced Corrupt Organizations which conduct it.

Complaint of City employee abuses

Please take notice that as per my phone conversation with Mary Ellen of the City Manager's office on Wednesday March 20, 2002 at about 2:20 PM I complain about another incident of abuse from an employee at the Cambridge Human Rights Commission. On Wednesday March 20, 2002 at about 12:30 AM (that's AM as in just after midnight), I called to the Cambridge police dispatcher to file a formal complaint about two Chinese assailants.

Dispatcher Landers sent HUPD officer George White who arrived at my apartment at about 1:15 AM. He refused to take a complaint in violation of the First Amendment to the US Constitution. Along with his hostile attitude he dismissed my concerns as insane ravings and suggested I call HPRE. This is the latest violation by HUPD of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990; the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and M.G.L. Chapter 151 B and Cambridge City Ordinances.

Some Cambridge Police refuse to take complaints about crime by Harvard employees contrary to law. This is due to an illegal agreement by City officers with Harvard officers.

On March 20, 2002 at about 1:25 AM I called to HPRE maintenance line to complain about this latest abuse. To be clear I am legally disabled. I am not legally insane. I am not a mental patient. I am not wanted for any crime. Being disabled is not a crime. Cambridge police officers are abusive and violate state, local and US laws. Police officers' and dispatchers' bias is a violation of state and US laws; negligent training.

On Wednesday March 20, 2002 at about 5:00 AM a Chinese male occupied apartment # 2 to begin assaults and sleep deprivation for that day. Earlier at about 1:30 AM after HUPD Officer White refused to take a complaint, I called to the Cambridge police again.

Supervising dispatcher Sheridan refused to send a Cambridge police officer to take the complaint. As per his request I called to the supervising dispatcher for the Cambridge police, Mr. Sheridan, and reported that the Chinese male was in apartment # 2 at 5:14 AM on Wednesday March 20, 2002. The refusal of Mr. Sheridan to send a Cambridge police officer to take the complaint is a violation of the First Amendment to the US Constitution, and state, local and US anti discrimination laws. Sheridan expressed his bias asking, "Are you seeing a doctor?" Please be advised of continuing harms and damages to me and my person. Sleep deprivation shortens one's life and causes illness.

This is the latest expression of unlawful City policy which makes certain kinds of discrimination more illegal than others. Gays, women, Chinese, and blacks enjoy attention from City agencies
