In the year One Thousand Eight-hundred and sixty.

An Ordinance

in relation to the Salary and Duties of the City Treasurer and Collector of Taxes.

As it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Sec. 1. The Collector of Taxes shall hereafter receive the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars for collecting the taxes assessed for the year in which he shall be chosen Collector.

Sec. 2. From and after the first Monday in January, in the year Eighteen Hundred and Sixty-one, the salary of the City Treasurer shall be five hundred dollars annually, payable in equal quarterly payments; which shall be in full for all services rendered by him in his official capacity.

Sec. 3. The office of the Treasurer shall be kept open for the transaction of official business, every day, between the hours of nine o'clock, A. M., and one o'clock, P. M.,

Sundays and holidays excepted.

Sec. 4. The eleventh section of the Ordinance in relation to the Collection of Taxes, on the one hundred and eightieth page of the Volume of City Ordinances, and so much of the Ordinance establishing the Salaries of City Officers, on the one hundred and twenty-seventh page of the same volume, as is inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.
