- *Stranded Costs* - specifically on consumer electric rates and the impact of "real competition" under deregulation. Stranded costs are estimated at 100% recovery (Attorney General's plan) to be \$12 billion; and
- *Municipal Aggregation* - the potential cost savings from creating a municipal aggregation which would include residential as well as small businesses; and
- *Weatherization* - the impact of cutbacks (90% reduction) to the average consumer.
