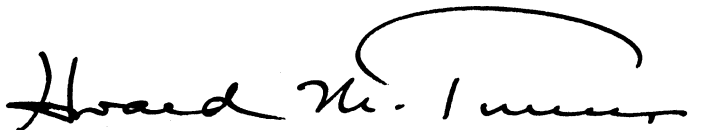

Dear Sir:

This is in answer to your letter of June 27th, enclosing a resolve of the Council of the City of Cambridge asking if the Buckingham School would be willing to have edgestones erected on Larch Road in front of their property. This property is used by the School for playground purposes only so that its use is confined chiefly to afternoons during the spring and fall. In the summer it is used by the Recreation Department of the City as a playground for children. There is very little traffic of any kind along here so that it does not appear that the edgestones are necessary and the School does not want to have them erected.
