WHEREAS: Federal mandates require compliance by local municipalities regardless of other pressing local needs and priorities affecting the health, welfare, and safety of municipal citizens; and

WHEREAS: Excessive federal burdens on local governments force some combination of higher local taxes and fees and/or reduced services on local citizens and taxpayers; and

WHEREAS: The cumulative effect of these legislative and regulatory actions directly affect the citizens of our cities and towns; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council does hereby declare the week of October 24 - 30 "National Unfunded Mandates Week, and supports the efforts of the National League of Cities, who has organized this effort, in continuing its successful national public education campaign to inform our citizens about the impact of unfunded federal mandates on local governments and our citizens; and be it further

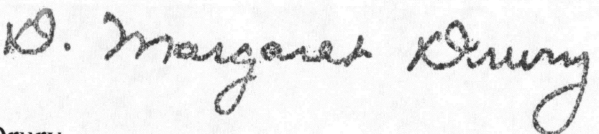
