AN ORDINANCE

In amendment to an Ordinance entitled "The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge".

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:

Chapter Thirteen entitled "Offenses" is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 13-19. Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages on Certain Public Places. No person shall drink any alcoholic beverages as defined in Chapter 138, Section 1 of the General Laws while on, in or upon any public way, or upon any way to which the public has a right to access, or any place to which the public has access as invitees or licensees, park or playground, or private place without the consent of the owner or person in control thereof. Whoever violates this Ordinance may be arrested without a warrant by an officer authorized to serve criminal process. All alcoholic beverages being used in violation of this Ordinance shall be seized and safely held until final adjudication of the charge against the person or persons arrested or summoned into court, at which time they shall be returned to the person or persons entitled to lawful possession. Anyone found guilty of the violation of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not over fifty dollars.
