WHEREAS: The United States House of Representatives has approved a bill (H.R. 1385) to consolidate over 60 federal job training programs into block grants to the states; and

WHEREAS: The U.S. Senate Committee on Labor and Human Resources has unanimously reported out its version (S. 1186) and a floor vote is forthcoming; and

WHEREAS: Both bills retain strong federal oversight and accountability, enhance some of the authority of governors for monitoring the evaluating local job training programs, establish a statewide collaborative process through which states would develop workforce goals and plans and maintain a local public/private partnership administered training and employment delivery system; and

WHEREAS: If the bills are enacted, city residents that need job training assistance would have a seamless customer-centered delivery system where they can obtain the job training assistance they need; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City of Cambridge calls upon our elected representatives in the United States Senate to approve S. 1186; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to send copies of this resolution to Senators Kerry and Kennedy.
