Dear Mr. Corcoran:

In regard to the Council Order requesting traffic signals for Sullivan Square be a priority item in the 1973 capital budget: I wish to inform you that there is no money in the capital improvement budget for any traffic signals.


Any money for new or revised traffic signal installations in the City of Cambridge have been requested under the federal "TOPICS" program, and as of now, our request for 1972 has not been acted upon.

The estimated cost of revising and signalizing this intersection is approximately \$45,000.00, an amount that the City cannot afford this year.

There are other intersections in the City of Cambridge that have a higher priority and to place this intersection above them would be improper, as it would only cause a dangerous condition to exist at the other location.

I have placed this intersection in my 1973 request from the state, but at the rate the state is moving, I doubt if it will be done this year.


