- WHEREAS: Vincent was a lifelong Cambridge resident; he was born in Cambridge on July 18, 1921; and
- WHEREAS: Vincent served his country with bravery and honor in the 10th Mountain Division of the United States Army during World War II; his battles and campaigns included the North Apennines in 1944-1945 and the Po Valley; and
- WHEREAS: For his distinguished military service in World War II, Vincent was awarded the Good Conduct Medal, the Victory Medal, the Purple Heart, the European-African-Middle Eastern Theater Campaign Ribbon and the Bronze Star Medal; and
- WHEREAS: On August 3, 1947, in Salem, Massachusetts, Vincent joined his heart and hand in matrimony with Anne, the love of his life; and
- WHEREAS: The marriage of Vincent and Anne was blessed with seven wonderful children, Gerald, John, Vincent and Joseph Pacelli, Rosemary Cowie, Bernadette Richard and Antoinette Powers; as the children grew up and started families of their own, Vincent and Anne became the doting grandparents of eleven grandchildren and the proud great grandparents of three; and
- WHEREAS: Vincent was the proprietor of Vinnie's Sandwich Shop; in addition to providing the local community with excellent sandwiches, in over 40 years in business, he never refused a sandwich to any hungry person with no money; and
- WHEREAS: Vincent was a faithful parishioner of Sacred Heart Church; and

WHEREAS: Vincent loved life; his many enthusiasms included gardening, cooking Italian food, his dog Toni, Sunday drives to New Hampshire with his family, Christmas Eve with his family and going to the Hilltop Steakhouse with his family; and

WHEREAS: Vincent passed away on February 13, 2002; and

WHEREAS: Vincent loved his family, his city and his country, and he served them all with enthusiasm, generosity and honor; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council go on record dedicating the corner of Thorndike Street and Fifth Street as:

Vincent A. Pacelli Square

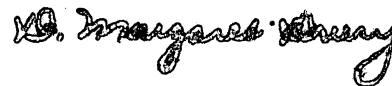
