Traffic Signals".

A study was conducted to determine the feasibility of installing traffic signals at this intersection and it was determined that they are not warranted at this time.

As for school children crossing there is a school crossing guard at this intersection along with a flashing red light facing Harvard Street traffic along with a stop sign. Even if a signal were installed at this intersection a school crossing guard would still have to cross children at this intersection as you cannot expect a child to press a button and wait for a walk light.

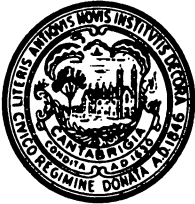
I will look at this intersection with a view towards making this intersection safer.
