MAYOR WOLF

- WHEREAS: Cambridge City Hall was the gift of Frederick Hastings Rindge, a native of Cambridge, to the City of Cambridge in memory of his father, Samuel Baker Rindge; and
- WHEREAS: The present City Hall has served the city and its residents handsomely for over one hundred years; and
- WHEREAS: City Hall is about to enter into its second century with a major restoration of its offices and public spaces; and
- WHEREAS: City Hall was accepted by the city and dedicated on December 13, 1890; and
- WHEREAS: The Historical Commission will soon publish a book about the 100-year history of City Hall; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council recognizes the importance of the building that is the center for the activities of city government, including previously some 4000 City Council meetings; and further be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council will recognize the Historical Commission's book, Cambridge City Hall, 1890-1990, with a celebration reception in January 1991, when the book is published; and further be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to be presented at the celebration.
