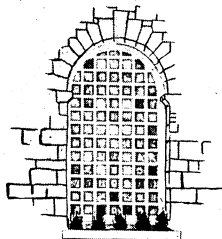

DEAR MAYOR MC NAMARA:

Last January 11, we of the Hellenic Orthodox Community of Cambridge were very saddened and shocked by the sudden death of one of our most active and beloved members, Mr. Photios Kyriacopoulos, better known as Fred A. Kyros.

The late Mr. Kyriacopoulos, a veteran of the 1st World War, was a prominent insurance broker and also was very active in Community, civic and Church affairs.

We of the Hellenic Orthodox Church, believe that a person of his caliber should be honored in a manner which will serve to keep alive and perpetuate the ideals he so conscientiously supported during his life time. "Thus", we propose, that the intersections of Magazine and Franklin Sts., be named in his honor, Photios Kyriakopoulos Square.

On Sunday July 12 there will be a six months memorial service for the late Mr. Kyriakopoulos at this church. We believe that, if it be possible, the dedication of the Square be accomplished on this day.

We of the Board of Trustees, confidently pray, Mr. Mayor, and the City Council, will give this matter the most favorable consideration.

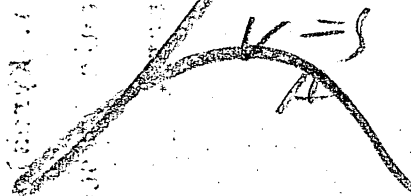
