SUBJECT: Council Order #11, 6/15/87 re: Report on Police Cars

In compliance with the 1984 submitted long range plan on the replacement of the Police Department motor vehicle fleet and the approved FY 1988 budget, the Police Department will replace the following vehicles in the coming year:

- * Seven (7) of the 21 marked vehicles will be replaced. This will follow the long range plan of replacing the marked vehicle every 36 months. Vehicles will be purchased on a 36 month lease/purchase plan.
- * Five (5) of the unmarked vehicles will be replaced. This is the first stage in replacing all the unmarked within the next five years. A lease/purchase finance plan will also be used.
- * Two (2) motorcycles will be purchased. One will be a replacement for a motorcycle totalled in an accident and the other will be to bring the complement of motorcycles to six.

It is unknown at this time which vehicles will be replaced. At the time of the actual delivery, an evaluation will be done of the present vehicles and, taking into account various factors such as mileage, body damage, engine status, etc, the least rated vehicles will be either sold at auction or junked.
