WHEREAS: Charles attended an electronics program at Stanford University and San Mateo College that taught him about radios and their repair and later used that knowledge as a radio technician for Pan American Airways during World War II when he was stationed in the Pacific; and

WHEREAS: Charles enlisted in the Army, also serving with the Navy and Army Air Forces before being discharged; and

WHEREAS: Charles completed his undergraduate education at Seattle University and earned a master's degree from MIT; and

WHEREAS: Charles helped to create the Haystack planetary radar and became the leader of a team involved in producing innovative radar systems; they produced a prototype radar for use in Vietnam that could detect the movement of people; and

WHEREAS: Charles won the Pioneer Award for the Moving Target Detector; and

WHEREAS: Charles was editor of the institute's journal, Transactions on Aerospace and Electronic Systems, for seven years and published hundreds of technical papers relating to his field; and

WHEREAS: Charles's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his wife Alice (Welk) Muehe; his children Barbara Hatch, Joan LaLiberty, Regina Harley and Theresa, Martha and Michael Muehe; and his four grandchildren; and
