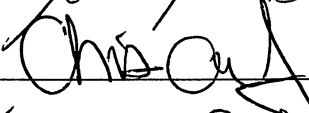
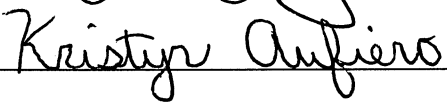
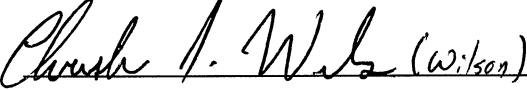
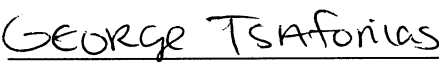
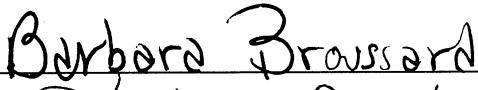
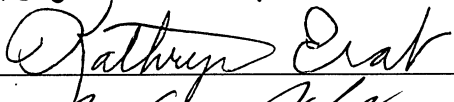
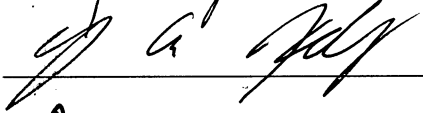
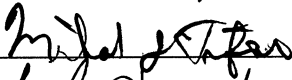
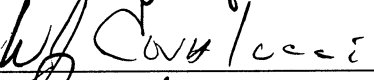
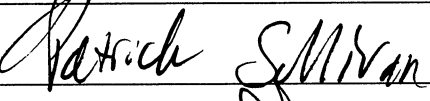
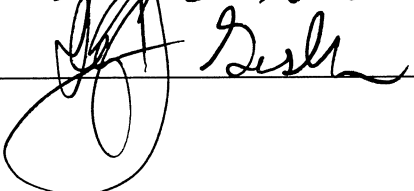


EASTERN CAMBRIDGE OPEN SPACE PETITION
