WHEREAS: The Wellmet Project, Inc. was founded in 1960 as a private, non-profit agency; and

WHEREAS: For thirty-five years, the Wellmet Project has successfully provided transitional housing and counseling services to mentally-ill adults; and

WHEREAS: For thirty-five years, the Wellmet Project has clearly demonstrated its strengths are in a home-like environment, with a high degree of integration in the surrounding community; and

WHEREAS: Leaders in the field of mental health from Cambridge have noted that "The most important issue is that a program like Wellmet exists and offers the option of residential care for patients whose life and family situation are so difficult that a stay for a period is life-saving and life-changing"; and

WHEREAS: The Wellmet Project currently provides services for 24 residents with a wide range of concerns and needs, with most residents having both quite limited incomes and levels of family support; and

WHEREAS: The Wellmet Project currently provides these services in two residential group homes in central Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: The staff of the Wellmet Project consists of professionally trained, prepared, experienced and "exceptionally devoted" individuals; and

WHEREAS: The staff and residents of the Wellmet Project have always made a concerted effort to be good neighbors in their respective Cambridge Communities; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record congratulating the Wellmet Project, Inc. for its thirty-five years of successful service, quality programming and community participation in our City; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Wellmet Project, Inc. on behalf of the entire City Council.

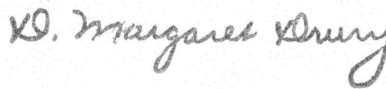
