- WHEREAS: Destruction of the stratospheric ozone layer is a global public health crisis that requires effective local action; and
- WHEREAS: Massachusetts uses significant quantities of CFC's and other ozone-destroying chemicals, particularly for industrial purposes; and
- WHEREAS: It would be detrimental to workers, consumers, and communities for corporations to replace chemicals that destroy the ozone layer with substances that may cause cancer, birth defects, or other health risks; and
- WHEREAS: Cambridge has already passed an ordinance restricting the use of chemicals that affect the ozone layer; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council endorses ozone protection legislation (H.5824) without a local pre-emption clause in order to phase out the use of ozone-depleting chemicals by 1995; provide for the recycling and reuse of CFC's; and ensure that these chemicals are replaced with safe alternatives; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare suitably engrossed copies of this resolution to be sent to State Senators Barrett, LoPresti, and Kraus, and State Representatives Flaherty, Thompson, and Vellucci, as well as Hillel Gray.
