WHEREAS: Although responsibility for clearing city sidewalks rests variously with private, institutional, public sector or municipal property owner, the fact remains that if the sidewalks in our city are not passable, it is dangerous for pedestrians who are forced to walk in the streets or slip and fall along the untended walks; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That a one hour public hearing be scheduled on February 28, 1994, inviting the City Manager, the Commissioner of Public Works and all interested pedestrians to hear their concerns and suggestions about better enforcement of the ordinance regarding sidewalk clearance and snow removal from bridges.
