- WHEREAS: The many citizen down zoning petitions being submitted to the City Council and Planning Board indicate the deep concern of residents about the effect of rapid development on the quality of life in the neighborhoods of our City; and
- WHEREAS: Issues of the lack of affordable housing and the impact of growing traffic and parking problems recur at every City Council meeting; and
- WHEREAS: Adequate responses to these issues are difficult to develop, and solutions are often contradictory to other goals - for example, requiring new parking/new unit, increases traffic and makes the likelihood of producing affordable units less; and
- WHEREAS: The City Council, as the policy setting body of the City, and the Planning Board, as its planning arm have some joint responsibility for deciding with these development and quality-of-life issues; therefore be it
- ORDERED: The City Manager is hereby requested to plan a joint meeting of the City Council and Planning Board to discuss how we jointly can make progress in developing responses to these myriad planning and development issues; and be it further
- ORDERED: That this meeting be well-planned and structural so that it can be constructive and can lead to constructive action.
