Whereas,

The City of Cambridge, by its collector of taxes, in the year 1878, sold and conveyed to Samuel B. Rindge, a certain parcel of land situated on Ellsworth Avenue, - such sale and conveyance being for a tax on said parcel of land assessed for the year 1877, - which land was subsequently reconveyed to said city by said Rindge, by deed recorded with Middlesex Co. Dist. Registry of Deeds, Book 1497, Page 109, and

Whereas,

The taxes upon the aforesaid parcel of land have been assessed, and ~~paid~~ paid since the year 1877; and it appears upon examination into the facts of the case that the city has now no equitable claim upon said land, while at the same time the city still holds the aforesaid deed of Samuel B. Rindge, - thereby creating a cloud upon the title to said land: it is therefore
