Dear Sir:

In reply to the order of the City Council, dated January 29th, 1973, I wish to answer as follows:

QUESTION #1: The Police are doing the Street Listing. They were chosen because I know of no other agency that would do a more accurate Street Listing in the time allotted.

QUESTION #2: I personally contacted the Supt. of the Cambridge Post Office asking him if his department would be interested in contracting to do the Street Listing. He was interested and stated that there were about 180 routemen in the department, and they could do an excellent job.

The Superintendent called me back, after talking to the Union officials, and informed me that they were not interested in doing any listing this year.

I then asked him to post a notice asking for volunteers, but there was no response.

Chief Reagan has assigned Captain Cusack the duty of selecting help from the Department, on a volunteer basis to do the Street Listing.

Captain Cusack has about 25 listing officers made up of policemen, auxiliary policemen and women traffic officers. This is almost double the amount of help that worked last year.

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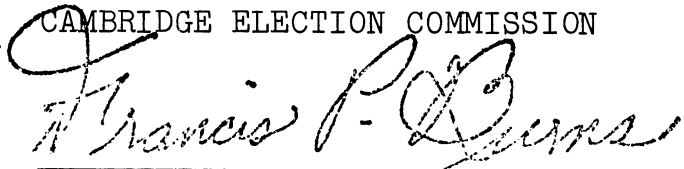
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At the present time, 22 of the 55 Precincts
