WHEREAS: The rush of routine can sometimes make us indifferent to the importance of some of the good things that are taking place in our Cambridge community, and one such is the work carried on by CASPAR (Cambridge and Somerville Program Alcohol Rehabilitation) at the Emergency Shelter on Albany Street where between 55 and 60 persons are provided not only emergency food and shelter for the short term, but for the long term are introduced to drug and alcohol programs of rehabilitation in an effort to assist the shelter's guests to return to the mainstream of life; and

WHEREAS: M.I.T.. is to be applauded for its community involvement by providing use of its land for the location of this temporary shelter, and likewise the Cambridge Housing Authority for its work in obtaining a Grant in the amount of \$2,500,000 from the Executive Office of Communities and Development to build a permanent residence to replace the temporary shelter; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager accelerate and intensify the search for land in Cambridge on which to build the new CASPAR residence so that the funds of the EOCD Grant are not at risk or in jeopardy of being lost due to a failure to act promptly, and further that the City Manager provide a progress report to the Council on this matter on May 1, 1989; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Clerk prepare two (2) duly engrossed copies of this Order and transmit same to the Board of Directors of CASPAR and the President of M.I.T. respectively.
