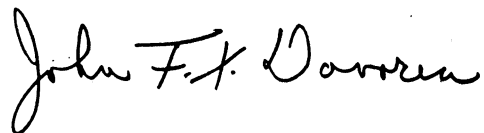

Purposes for which the Corporation is Formed

1. The corporation is organized to engage in scientific research on the effect of improved nutrition and on other medical and scientific topics, to administer a Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants and Children pursuant to the Child Nutrition Act of 1966, as amended (42 U.S.C. 1771 et. seq.) and to engage in all other activities which are proper or necessary in connection therewith. The corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).
2. The corporation shall have, and may exercise in the furtherance of the foregoing purposes, the power to solicit and receive gifts, grants, contributions, and bequests, and to engage in fund-raising activities; the powers specified in Section Nine of Chapter 156B of the General Laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (except the powers specified in paragraph (m) thereof) and the power to be a partner in any enterprise which the corporation would have the power to conduct by itself, provided that no such power shall be exercised in a manner inconsistent with Chapter 180 or any other chapter of said General Laws, and further provided that no part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the foregoing purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under sections 170(c)(2), 2055(a)(2), or 2522 (a)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).
