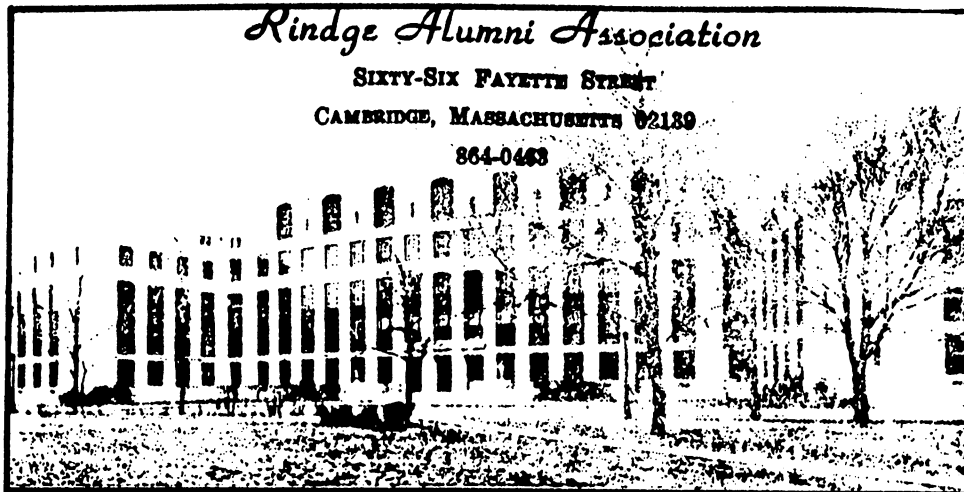

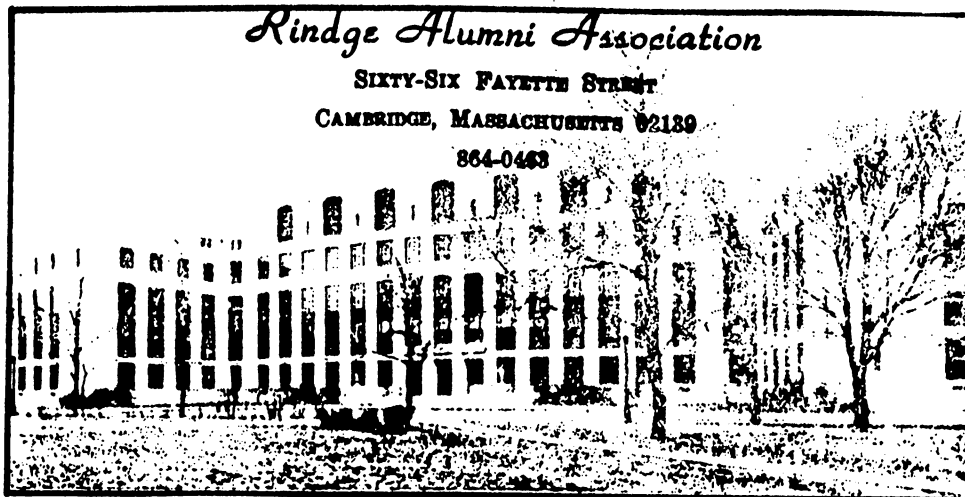

- WHEREAS: A century ago Rindge Technical was founded by the late Frederick H. Rindge, a truly altruistic gentleman, who earnestly believed in the importance of education, not only addressing Arts and Sciences but technical training as well; and
- WHEREAS: Since its founding in 1888 the school has been transformed to include not only technical training but a comprehensive facility with multi-level academic disciplines with a broad based curriculum for all its students; and
- WHEREAS: In 1896 Alumni of Rindge formally organized an Alumni Association which will celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the school on Monday, November 21, 1988 at the Hillcrest Restaurant in Waltham and included within the program of the evening the Alumni Association will present the "Man of the Year" award to John and Ronald Rindge, grandsons of Frederick H. Rindge in recognition of the tremendous gifts their late grandfather bestowed on the City of Cambridge; a tradition which began in 1926 and has only been granted to ten previous recipients as follows:
