Trial lawyer from Hudson

A funeral Mass will be said today for William J. Kittredge Jr. of Hudson and Manomet, an attorney who died Friday in Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston. He was 72.

Mr. Kittredge was born in Hudson. He graduated from St. Mary's High School in Waltham, Miami of Ohio University, and, in 1953, from Boston College Law School. He served in the Navy during World War II.

He was a senior partner at Kittredge Moreira and Acton law firm in Hudson and was a noted trial lawyer.

He was a tenured professor of criminal law at Boston State College, which is now part of the University of Massachusetts system.

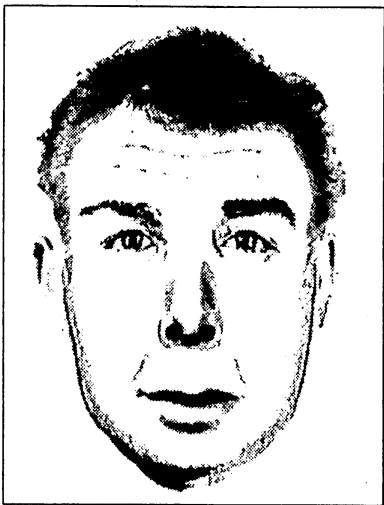
He was a member of the Massachusetts Bar Association since 1952. He belonged to the Plymouth Country Club since 1953.

He leaves his two sons, William J.
