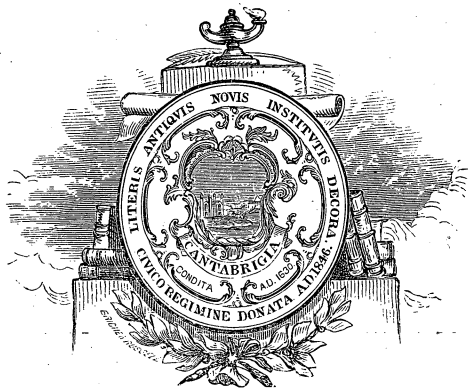

ed was sold Nov. 6. 1865, to Timothy T. Chen,  
and another fourth, Nov. 11. 1865, to William Lang.  
The work was done in November and the as-  
sessment made Dec. 27. 1865, and is a lien on  
the estates.

It seems proper that one fourth of the tax  
should be transferred to each of the persons
