- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that two white individuals were assaulted and robbed on Saturday, June 2, 1984 by approximately twenty to thirty blacks near the Fresh Pond Shopping Center; and
- WHEREAS: While many people witnessed this attack but refused to provide any assistance, but fortunately, there were two people, Fasiel Flash of Dorchester and his girlfriend Stacey Halcombe of Somerville, who, upon arrival at the scene did come to the assistance of Michael and James Lyons, and their efforts proved to be life saving to these individuals, particularly Michael, who received fourteen stitches for a knife wound; and
- WHEREAS: This City Council recently held several discussions regarding racial assaults and harassment throughout this area and it wishes to highlight the humanitarian efforts of Fasiel Flash and Stacey Halcombe, who ignored the "so-called" racial barrier and came to the aid of two white youths being viciously assaulted; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record commending Fasiel Flash and Stacey Halcombe for their courage and good judgment, while it meant placing themselves in danger by helping these two youths; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mr. Flash and Ms. Halcombe in official recognition of their action on behalf of the entire City Council.

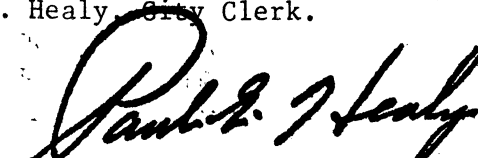
