American dads: The world's most "gifted"

Of all the dads in the world, Americans are the most "gifted," because Americans are the "givingest" people on the face of the earth.

There are just about 70,000,000 dads in this great country of ours, and research done by the Father's Day Council shows that the "median father" will be getting two and a half gifts! Given an average total gift value per dad of about \$70 (up from about \$40 just five years ago), that's not far from five and half billion dollars, projected by the Father's Day Council research, for Father's Day gifts.

In fact, the expenditure per father is just shade over what he gets for Christmas, when he has to share the charge account payments with gifts for mother, sisters, brothers, children and friends.

The first choice

The gift option favored by a margin of almost two and a half to one is "something to wear." Shirts, ties, sports shirts, slacks,

jewelry, socks, underwear, robes, swimwear, pajamas — often things he put off buying for himself because someone else in the family seemed to have a more urgent need. Come Father's Day, dad is king and the gifts shower down on him.

And who knows what he needs better than mother, who probably sorts out his laundry and, if she doesn't do it, she at least stashes it away when it comes back from the cleaners. She knows best — when collars become frayed and socks develop holes.

"The more the merrier"

Next in line as a gift favorite is "toiletries" — colognes, after shave lotion, and skin care products, a wide range of male cosmetics that have become increasingly popular in just a decade, and right behind these come spirited beverages.

All of them are easy to buy because there is no size or color question (one size "fits all" — and if the size is too big, who cares? It's just a case of "the more the merrier") These gifts come pre-packaged and can be picked up at the last minute ready-gift wrapped for the next day giving.

Not too far behind are hobby gifts, including photographic equipment, games and tools for the do-it-yourself man-about-the-house, as so many dads want to

be today.

In the same vein comes sports gear for active participation. Golf clubs, golf balls and all kinds of accessories; tennis racquets and balls, and the countless accessories needed to keep dad's game in top form. Then there are fishing dads, swimming dads, boating dads and gardening and "cook-out" dads. Add them together and the number of gift choices is almost unending.

Jewelry comes and goes with fashion swings. But stands include ID bracelets, cuff links and collar pins or clips, distinctive rings, money clips and wallets, running the gamut of useful and prestigious accessories that set your dad off from the rest.

Leave it up to dad

If you're still stumped after all these ideas, you can always solve your gift quandary with a gift certificate from his favorite store. That way you can leave the responsibility of choice up to him and know that you can't go wrong.

The best gift of all is your love and affection. After that, anything your pocketbook can stand will be on the plus side — for you and for dad. But don't forget, whatever you do. This year, Father's Day is Sunday, June 16th.

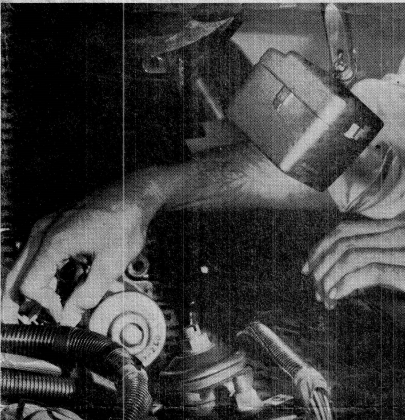
Stan Smith Poster Father for 1985

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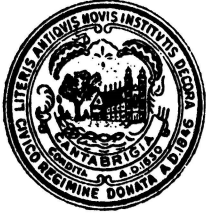
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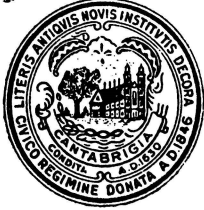

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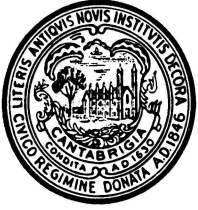

To the Honorable, the City Council:

Enclosed for your consideration is an amendment to the Salary Ordinance for Department Heads. Inasmuch as the majority of the Collective Bargaining units in the City have either ratified agreements or have tentatively reached agreement, subject to ratification, I am submitting this amendment to increase managerial salaries on approximately the same terms as the union settlements.

This amendment recommends a two-percent increase effective January 1, 1985, and a five-percent increase effective July 1, 1985.
