IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

October 17, 1911.

Whereas: The hereinafter named employee of the City of Cambridge in the Police department, was injured while in the performance of his duty, and was incapacitated physically for the performance of such duties for the period of time stated against his name, all by reason of injuries sustained in the discharge of such duties without fault on the part of said employee, it is Ordered,

That the Chief of Police be authorized under the provisions of Chapter 213 of the Legislative Acts of this Commonwealth for the year 1899, to continue the pay of said employee during the time in which he was incapacitated as before stated, viz.:—

Edward J. McCabe, 17 days from August 20, 1910.

Provided: That said McCabe before receiving the continuance of pay as herein authorized, shall file with the City Treasurer a satisfactory release from all claims against the city, by reason of the injuries received as before stated.
