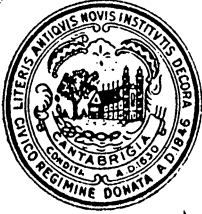

## AN ORDINANCE

In amendment to an ordinance formerly entitled "The General Ordinances of the City of Cambridge" as revised in 1972 and now designated as "The Code of the City of Cambridge".

*Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:*

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B. Mar or deface a building or signboard, or extinguish a light, or break, destroy or remove a lamp, lamp post, railing or post erected on a bridge, sidewalk, public way, court or passage.

C. Deface or otherwise injure, remove, interfere with or destroy any traffic regulating sign, light, signal, marking or device lawfully erected or placed under public authority on any public way.

D. Or wantonly and without cause, destroy, deface, mar, or injure a schoolhouse, church or other building erected or used for purposes of education or religious instruction, or for the general diffusion of knowledge, or an outbuilding, fence, well or appurtenance of such schoolhouse, church or other building, or furniture, apparatus or other property belonging thereto or connected therewith.

E. Or wantonly and without cause, destroy, deface, mar or injure any playground apparatus or equipment located in a public park or playground.

F. Destroy, injure, deface or mar a dwelling house or other building, whether upon the inside or outside.

G. Mar or injure the wells, wainscoting or any other part of a courthouse, or any other building or room used for county business or any building belonging to the Commonwealth or any building belonging to the City of Cambridge or the appurtenances thereof, by cutting, writing or otherwise.

H. Maliciously remove, displace, destroy, deface, mar or injure any monument, tablet or other device erected to mark an historic place or to commemorate an historic event.

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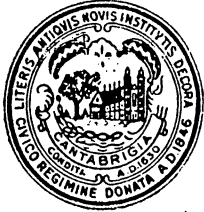

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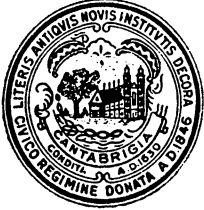

The organization(s) responsible for the distribution of posters or flyers which are in violation of this ordinance shall be responsible for the immediate removal of said posters or flyers and the names of such organization(s) shall be forwarded to the appropriate area businessmen's association so that the association may notify said organization that such acts are prohibited by City Ordinance.

To: Honorable Members of the Cambridge City Council

RE: Proposed Amendment to City Ordinance Against Illegal Posters

Our Association respectfully requests your favorable consideration to an amendment to an existing City Ordinance against posting bills and signs on public or private property by holding responsible for such illegal action the organization or entity whose name(s) appear on such posters.

Last summer, as a joint result of the combined efforts of the City of Cambridge through the Public Works Department, neighborhood groups, our business association, the MBTA, and youth groups, an extensive and very successful campaign was instituted to physically clean up Central Square. It was a great success, and shows what can be done. Hundreds of people cooperated, resulting in streets and sidewalks being clean, subway exits and entrances were clean (the MBTA had a crew of 3 men working on this for 1 week) and all posters and signs were removed, along with the dirt and debris. Unfortunately, the posters now abound in profusion and they are an ugly eyesore, and contribute to the dirt and unsightly appearance of Central Square. Both public and private property is involved.

We strongly urge the City Council to revise the ordinance so that it will place the responsibility directly where it belongs, on those who authorize and pay for the illegal posting of said signs. This would require that the ordinance specifically include this provision. Without it, the police are powerless to assist us, as well as the Court.
