

The following is a copy from the
Records under date of August 6. 1873.

"The following Order was adopted;

Whereas, In the opinion of the
Board, the public safety and convenience
require that Pleasant and Upton Streets
should be laid out as public ways,
it is therefore hereby

Ordered, That due notice be given to
the abutters on said Pleasant and Upton
Streets, and all other persons interested, that
this Board intends to lay out the streets before
mentioned, by taking a portion of their land,
and laying out the same as public streets,
and that Wednesday, the 3^d day of September
next, at 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock, P. M., is assigned as the
time for hearing any objections which may
be made thereto."

[Under date of September 3. 1873.]

"The Special Assignment being in order,
to wit; the hearing in relation to laying out
Pleasant and Upton Streets, William A. Munroe
Esq.

and Mr. John Mahady were heard
in relation to Pleasant Street.

The papers were then recommitted."
