- WHEREAS: This City Council wishes to recognize and commend exemplary performance by members of the Cambridge Police Department; and
- WHEREAS: During the early morning hours of October 22, 1984 Patrol Officer James DeFrancesco observed two motor vehicles at Lincoln and Windsor Streets whose occupants were acting in a suspicious manner; and
- WHEREAS: Officer DeFrancesco immediately broadcast a description of both vehicles as they headed in the direction of Lafayette Square; and
- WHEREAS: Officers Edward Liberacki and James Voutiritsa, while patrolling in another car, had occasion to stop the vehicles at Massachusetts Avenue near Brookline Street; and
- WHEREAS: The suspect was ordered out of the vehicle and, as he was emerging, a chrome plated MP25 automatic pistol fell to the ground; and
- WHEREAS: A subsequent search of the suspect produced a number of personal checks, a large amount of cash, and two ounces of cocaine; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council do hereby officially congratulate and commend Patrol Officers James DeFrancesco, Edward Liberacki and James Voutiritsa for their quick response and keen powers of observation displayed in the line of duty on October 22, 1984; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That a copy of this City Council resolution be made part of their permanent record.
