- WHEREAS:** This City Council has great respect for Cambridge's senior citizens as well as a profound concern for the quality of life available to our older residents; and
- WHEREAS:** Many of the Cambridge Housing Authority's senior residences have sizeable common room areas which lend themselves nicely to group activities and entertainment; and
- WHEREAS:** Currently many of these Common Rooms sponsor weekly Bingo or card games, but there is an obvious need for additional programming; and
- WHEREAS:** Weekly or bi-weekly programs could be simply and inexpensively provided at these locations through the collaboration of the Department of Human Services, the Cambridge Housing Authority and the Cambridge Arts Council, as well as the Cambridge Street Artists' Guild; and
- WHEREAS:** The cost of such entertainment might easily be borne by a public/private partnership if the schedule of costs could be developed by the City Manager and the above-mentioned agencies; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED:** That this City Council request the City Manager to consult with the Department of Human Services, the Cambridge Housing Authority, and the Cambridge Arts Council on the feasibility of providing periodic entertainments--musical and otherwise--for senior citizens, and most particularly in the common rooms of public housing residences which are substantially occupied by senior citizens, to include but not limited to: Manning, LBJ, and Truman Apartments, Essex Street and Miller River.
