Malcolm M. Donahue, former associate professor at Suffolk University, died Thursday at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston after a brief illness. He was 67.

Born in Boston, Mr. Donahue graduated from Phillips Exeter Academy in Andover in 1940 and from Harvard College in 1944. He received his law degree from Boston University School of Law.

He served in the Army from 1943-1946, one year in the Philippines with the 1st Cavalry Division during World War II.

Mr. Donahue practiced law for many years and served as assistant attorney general from 1953-1956. In 1957, he was appointed professor of law at Suffolk University Law School. He served as dean from 1973-1990.

A resident of West Roxbury for many years, Mr. Donahue was a member of the town council.
