ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to request from Harvard a description of the policy for public use of the tennis courts at the Observatory on Garden Street, which courts were the subject of an agreement between Harvard and the community as to public use at the time of the construction of the gymnasium; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to report to the City Council on how many tennis courts there are in question which are available to the public.
