To the owners of property in the vicinity of 94 Brattle Street, Longfellow Historic District:

The Cambridge Historical Commission has received from Mr. and Mrs. William J. LeMessurier an application for a Certificate of Appropriateness for the following exterior alterations to the property located at 94 Brattle Street:

1. Painting the shutters red-black
2. Installation of granite steps at the main entrance of the dwelling
3. Installation at the southern end of the lowest step of a post, not to exceed eight feet in height, on which will be mounted an hexagonal lamp, nineteen inches in height, of glass and black painted copper

Under the provisions of the Historic District Act, General Laws Chapter 40 C, Section 12, the Cambridge Historical Commission may dispense with a public hearing on this application and proceed to issue a Certificate of Appropriateness for the proposed alterations, provided that the alterations are deemed to be insubstantial in their effect on the Historic District and that ten days' prior notice is given to the owners of adjoining property and of property deemed to be materially affected by such alterations. We deem the effect of the proposed alterations to be insubstantial and your property to be among those materially affected.

Should you have any objection to the issuance of a Certificate of Appropriateness for the alterations described above, please notify the Cambridge Historical Commission at the above address within ten days.

The Cambridge Historical Commission has received from the Cambridge Historical Society an application for a Certificate of Appropriateness for the following exterior alteration to the property located at 159 Brattle Street:

Painting the front fence ocher-white (off-white) to match the color of the house trim

Under the provisions of the Historic District Act, General Laws Chapter 40 C, Section 12, the Cambridge Historical Commission may dispense with a public hearing on this application and proceed to issue a Certificate of Appropriateness for the proposed alteration, provided that the alteration is deemed to be insubstantial in its effect on the Historic District and that ten days' prior notice is given to the owners of adjoining property and of property deemed to be materially affected by such alteration.
