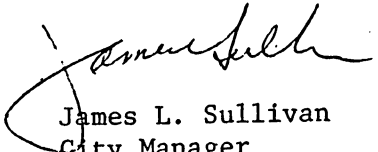
Dear Mr. Siflinger:

I have reviewed the Cambridge Housing Authority's application for funding which has been submitted to your office.

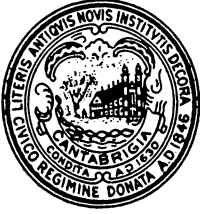
