

Edwin B. Newman, 81

Psychologist at Harvard

Edwin B. Newman, a psychologist at Harvard University from 1943 until his retirement in 1979, died Saturday in Brigham and Women's Hospital of complications from liver surgery. He was 81 and lived in Cambridge.

Mr. Newman, chairman of Harvard's psychology department from 1947 to 1965 and from 1971 to 1973, conducted research into hearing and into learning as a means of communication.

He was also a member of several mental health advisory boards since 1968 and a former trustee of Westborough State Hospital.

A native of Baltimore, Mr. Newman graduated from Morgan Park High School in Chicago in 1924 and the University of Kansas in 1928. He received a master's degree in psychology at Kansas in 1930 and a doctorate at Harvard in 1934.

Mr. Newman taught at Swarthmore College before coming to Harvard as associate director of its Psycho-acoustic Laboratory during World War II.

He maintained a farm on Mount Desert Island, Maine.

Mr. Newman leaves his wife, Mary B. (Temple); and a brother, William H. of Kennett Square, Pa.

A memorial service is being planned.
