Special Sewer Assessment.

On Feb. 21, 1951, I wrote to you recommending a special sewer assessment on land on Elmwood Street, owned by Mr. Bishop and for permission to Mr. Bishop to connect his property to the sewer in Cameron Avenue. This connection was to be made over land not owned by Mr. Bishop.

The City Council so ordered on March 12, 1951.

Mr. Bishop has now made arrangements to connect his property to the Somerville sewer and has no need of the Cambridge sewer. His connection as now planned will be very much shorter than at first planned and will be much easier for him to maintain.

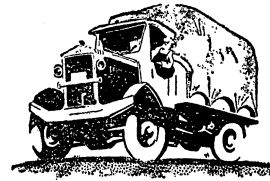
I am enclosing Mr. Bishop's letter which is self-explanatory and would recommend that the City Council rescind their action of March 12, 1951, which orders the special sewer assessment of \$170.00 also, authorizing the return of \$170.00 to Mr. Bishop which he has deposited in the city treasury.

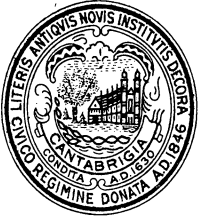
On Jan. 25, 1951, I sent the City of Cambridge a check for \$170.<sup>00</sup>; the betterment fee for a sewer permit. In order to tie in with the Cambridge sewer line, we would have to come in from Cameron Ave., and then through private property. Although we didn't like the idea of laying pipe in another person's yard and all the red tape connected with this method, at the time it was the only thing I could do. Now, however, Somerville has given permission to tie in with their line. This is much easier and will save me a lot of headaches.


