Dr. Rosenthal was Director of Health & Physical Education Board of Education (1960-1972), an officer during WW II, retiring as a colonel in 1974, and a 1972 Inductee into National Soccer Hall of Fame. Born in and raised in New York City, he was James Monroe HS, and was elected to the Alumni Sports Hall of Fame. Dr. Rosenthal graduated City College of New York, where he was on the soccer and boxing teams. He received a Ph.D. in education from New York University and a doctorate in education from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst. He then DeWitt Clinton HS, and then Christopher Columbus HS as Deputy Chairman. He was well known for his coaching courses he ran to assist young coaches preparing for their chairman's duties. He was an active member of the National Collegiate Soccer Officials Association, officiating seven games a week, and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1987. He
